SRC Update: March 2019

The SRC has continued to be active and engaged over the past month. Activities have included:

- a visit from the Avalon branch of **Amnesty International**. Andrew Greig gave a presentation to the SRC and other interested students on what Amnesty is and how students can get involved.
- the SRC has decided to establish a separate **Social Justice Group**. The aim of the group will be to engage with charities and causes of interest to students, playing an active role in engaging in social justice campaigns and also holding fundraisers for focus charities. The Social Justice Group intends to meet regularly (probably fortnightly) and be open to all students at the school, not only SRC members. Teacher supervision and guidance will be provided although it should be a student-led initiative.
- **Harmony Day** event to be held on Thursday 21st March. The week was started with a short speech from Vice Captain Skye Holloway to the school outdoor assembly, talking about the importance of inclusiveness and respect for diversity. Temporary tattoos with orange harmony themes have been designed by Skye Holloway and will be sold for 50c each. A multicultural food and cake sale will also be held. All funds raised are to be donated to a charity supporting the families of the victims of the Christchurch shootings.
- Many SRC students are planning to attend the upcoming School **Working Bee** on 6 April.
- The SRC is planning to ensure positive attendance at the **Dawn Ceremony and the ANZAC March** in Avalon during the school holidays on 25 April.

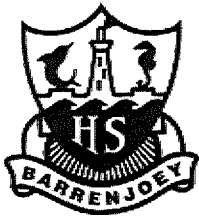
